A MEMORIAL TO SHIPP.

The Charlotte Observer Inaugurates a movement to erect a monument to Lieutenant William E. Shipp, who fell before Santiago

It is but fitting that the first steps toward an object so worthy should be taken in Charlotte, of which city Lieutensut Shipp's father was for many years an honored citizen. Raleigh had in the young soldier an interest deep and pathetic, and will warmly second the initiative of the Observer to honor his memory.
